



AUSTRALIA'S BUSHFIRES DEVASTATE NATIVE WILDLIFE AND BUSHLANDS

Australians, and the world have been shocked and saddened by the extent and ferocity of the recent bushfires. Whilst the media has focused (quite rightly) on the loss of life, property destruction and the efforts and tenacity of the firefighters, another loss has taken place which is equally as tragic. This is the destruction of vast areas of natural habitat, from tall eucalypt forests to coastal heath and alpine woodlands. National Parks and Nature Reserves, which protected important ecosystems have been reduced to ash.

With this destruction comes the decimation of the bushland's inhabitants - its koalas, wallabies, possums, other marsupials, birds, reptiles and insects. And who knows what effect the fires have had on endangered species, such as the potoroo and ground parrot? The shrubs and tree cover of the bushland will eventually recover, but there is no certainty that the animal life will regain its numbers and diversity. As conservationists we must promote wise decision-making in the post-fire period and hope that our natural environment continues to be managed in a scientifically based and sympathetic manner.

We encourage members, as well as making donations to relief agencies, to also donate to wildlife rescue and rehabilitation organisations. An easy way to ensure that your donation goes most effectively to rescue groups is to follow the NCC's (Nature Conservation Council) advice and donate to [NSW Wildlife Council's Wildlife Drought and Fire Recovery Fund](#), or the [Australian Wildlife Society's Wildlife in Fires appeal](#). OFF is a member of the NCC and is confident that funds will be distributed to a range of wildlife rescue groups as needed.

MYLES DUNPHY RESERVE FLYING FOXES

During the recent hot weather there was a "heat stress" event in the flying fox camp located in the reserve. This led to the death of some animals, including young. It is normal for flying foxes to come low in extreme heat, but they can become stressed and panic if people go near them.



We therefore ask that members and the public assist in the recovery of the colony as follows:

1. Avoid the reserve on any day where the temperature exceeds 40 degrees.
2. Do not attempt to handle any flying foxes.
3. Call WIRES on 1300 094 737 if you have any concerns.

Notes: The substantial deficit is almost totally a timing issue for the \$30K grant we received in 2017 and spent in 2019. So the deficit here is offset by the \$37K surplus we had in 2017.

The best way to determine the position of the organisation is in the balance of cash at the bank without the Grants monies included. This shows the total going from \$15,820 at Jan 1st 2019 to \$19,439 at Dec 31st 2019.
